Special Status Species

There are 13 threatened or endangered species federally protected under the Endangered Species Act (ESA) and one proposed species that occur or potentially occur in the analysis area.

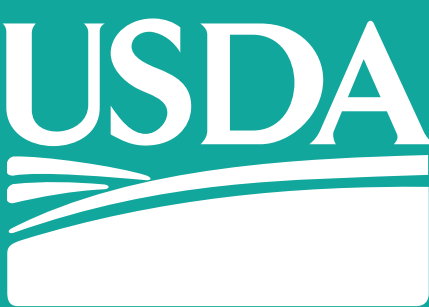
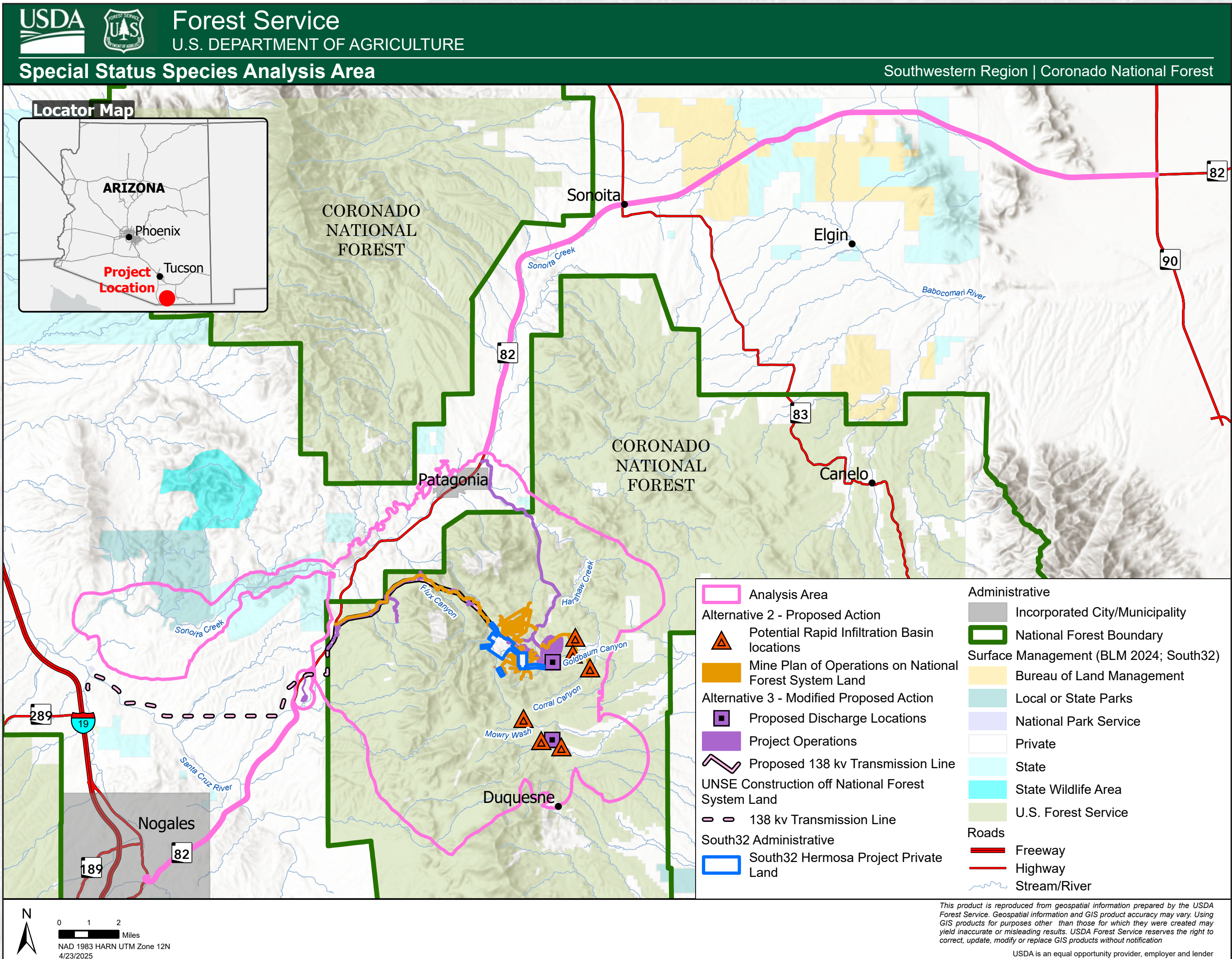
There are several additional wildlife, fish, and plant species on the Regional Forester’s Sensitive Species list for the Coronado National Forest that also have potential to occur in and around the analysis area.

Potential effects to special status species are described for each alternative within the DEIS. The following effects were analyzed:

- Surface disturbance
 - Human presence
 - Invasive species
 - Noise
 - Vehicle traffic
 - Dust / Air Quality
- Light
 - Vibration
 - Groundwater changes
 - Surface water changes

The analysis area was defined as the full spatial extent to which these impacts would extend.
